

**Directions to
Bellamy Middle School
314 Pendleton Avenue, Chicopee, MA**

Traveling North or South on Route 91:

- Take exit 12 for merge onto I-391N, then take exit 3 and take a right off the exit. Then bear left at the light for Granby Road. Stay on Granby Road through two sets of lights until you reach the rotary at Route 33.
- Take a left, staying in the left lane on Route 33N. Take a left at the second light (sign at left for Route 116, Williamansett) for Pendleton Avenue.
- Proceed on Pendleton Avenue for .5 miles until you see the school zone sign. Turn right for Bellamy School entrance. Parking is on all sides of the building.

From Mass Pike:

- Take exit 5 (Chicopee Exit) and bear right on toll road. At the end of the toll road go through the light and go left onto Route 33.
- After approximately .9 miles take a left at the second light, (sign at left for Route 116, Williamansett) for Pendleton Avenue.
- Proceed on Pendleton Avenue for about .5 miles and Bellamy Middle School will be on your right. Parking is on all sides of the building.



He then left the financial world for a full-time work in Catholic education at the classical-curriculum academy him and his wife founded in NH (New England Classical Academy) after moving there to be near his newly-widowed mother-in-law and not finding any adequate educational options for his 5 children. Few months ago he joined the Faculty at CUA in DC where he teaches Finance and Tax law. When he is not in his office or with students in a classroom, he can be often found speaking at conferences or men's retreats where he shares about the role Saint John Paul II had in helping him into a better man, executive and leader.



SAM TODZIA

Sam Todzia is a Catholic husband, father, carpenter, and speaker with a passion to engage all people with the Gospel and living out the Catholic faith. His company, Red Barn Ministries (www.redbarnministries.org), primarily focuses on reaching young people, but Sam also runs a men's ministry called Meat & Greet. This unique ministry aims to gather together men of faith and strengthen their resolve to live out their calling as Catholic men with confidence and conviction. Sam lives in Higganum, Connecticut with his wife and four children. He holds a master's degree in Theology from Holy Apostles College and Seminary in Cromwell, CT.

SEAN FORREST



In January of 2000, Sean founded Movin' With The Spirit, Inc. (MWTS), a not-for-profit organization dedicated to boldly proclaiming God's eternal Truth and love. The group's mission was to reach out to the lost and lonely in the name of Christ.

Since then, Sean has had the opportunity to speak to hundreds of thousands of teens and adults across the country and internationally. He has been a guest on multiple programs on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) and has been featured in nationally recognized magazines and newspapers. Sean has performed and spoken at venues such as: The National Catholic Youth Conference, World Youth Day, and the Creation fest and Soul fest Christian music festivals. He is an annual keynote speaker at the Steubenville youth conferences and challenges men at diocesan men's conferences throughout the country to live their faith and lead others to Christ. He reaches out to booth the hearts and minds of his audiences, in keeping with the focus of Pope John Paul II's Fides et Ratio (Faith and Reason).

Sean's music has earned him honors at the UCMVA UNITY Awards. For his extensive work with the groundbreaking youth ministry, he was the recipient of the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry's "For God and Youth" award.
